
### Matthew 25:31-45 (ESV) The Final Judgment

<sup>31</sup> "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. <sup>32</sup> Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. 33 And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. <sup>34</sup> Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. <sup>35</sup> For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, <sup>36</sup> I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' 37 Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? <sup>38</sup> And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? <sup>39</sup> And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' 40 And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, vou did it to me.'

<sup>41</sup> "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. 42 For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, <sup>43</sup> I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' 44 Then they also will answer, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?' 45 Then he will answer them, saying, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.'

Philippians 2:1-11 (ESV) Christ's Example of Humility
2 So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any
participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, <sup>2</sup> complete my joy by being
of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do
nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more
significant than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but
also to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in
Christ Jesus, <sup>[a] 6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with
God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, <sup>[b]</sup>
being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup> And being found in human form, he humbled
himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
<sup>9</sup> Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is
above every name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in
heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue confess that Jesus
Christ is Lord. to the glory of God the Father.
